Improving Inclusivity within Research

BAME groups are more likely to suffer from poorer health outcomes and health and social care inequalities and less likely to be represented in health and social care research studies. 1. Intro to PPI: what can PPI do for you?

This session is for anyone new to PPI. Learn what patient and public involvement is all about, and how it can help your research. Pick up some of the basics of incorporating patient involvement into your work.

2. How to fill in the PPI section of a grant form and write a lay summary







This session is for anyone struggling to work PPI into their funding applications. Learn what funders are looking for, and at what stage of applying for funding you should be seeking patient input.

3. How to find patient partners and keep them involved

This session is for anyone looking to involve patients in their research. Learn where to go to find people who will get involved, and how to help them remain engaged.

4. Facilitation: how to get the most out of your PPI activities

This session is for anyone looking to run workshops of focus groups. Learn how to get the most out of your meetings.

5. How to do PPI: focus groups and more

This session is for anyone who understands the role of PPI and wants to put their learning into practice. The session examines PPI methods in depth, including cost, how to choose the right method for your project, and with a particular look at how to run a PPI focus group.

6. Patient and public involvement in lab-based and early clinical research

A workshop on Patient and Public Involvement in lab-based and early clinical research; originally designed and held for researchers funded by the NIHR Blood and Transplant Research Unit (BTRU) in Stem Cells and Immunotherapies at UCL, it is now open to all and consists of two parts:
