#### Applications to the small and large grant funding is now open!

The small grant is a monthly funding scheme (excluding December, June-August) that provides grants of up to £1,000 to enable Queen Mary staff and students the opportunity to deliver small-scale projects that engage the public with University research, teaching, or core business. Large Grants is an annual funding scheme that provides grants of up to £10,000 to enable Queen Mary staff and students the opportunity to undertake projects of a larger scope, scale, or legacy to engage the public with University research, teaching, or core business.
